EXHIBITIONS (admission free)

3 – 29 October: Barbican Foyer Exhibition Young Creatives on Change

Work by young creatives from our Barbican Guildhall Creative Learning programmes will be presented in a new exhibition at the Barbican Library. Tying in with National Poetry Day, for the month of October the exhibition will include work by the Barbican Young Poets and Young Visual Artists on the theme of change and will be part of a celebration of ten years of the Barbican Young Poets. The exhibition will include Barbican Young Poets alumni performing a repertoire from this exhibition at a live public event at the Barbican Library, mc'd by Jacob Sam La Rose.

16 October —31 December : Barbican Music Library Exhibition Women in Jazz

A musical and social survey of the rich contribution women have made to jazz over the last 100 years, and of the talented upcoming generation who herald an exciting new era. The exhibition pays particular attention to instrumentalists. While many vocalists such as Ella, Billie, Nina and Cleo are household names, many star players and pioneers have been sadly neglected and deserve to be rediscovered. Drawing on the rich resources of the National Jazz Archive the exhibition includes photos, posters, journals, video and memorabilia.

Africa's Great War – the story of the war in Africa and of Africans on the Western Front: A Talk by Nick Dobson

When we think of the Great War, the image that most readily comes to mind is that of trench warfare on the Western Front. However, the war was a World War and the first shots fired by British Troops were fired in Africa. This is the fascinating story of Africa's Great War from that first conflict until the German surrender which took place after the war had ended in Europe. We will also see how the war helped shape African nationality and still influences the politics of a continent nearly a century later. Free entry, no need to book.


