Barbican announces Lloyd Cole performance with full band for January 2025

Lloyd Cole & Band Saturday 25 January 2025, 8pm Barbican Hall Tickets from £35 plus booking fee

Lloyd Cole will take to the Barbican Hall in January 2025, joined by a full band featuring founding members of The Commotions, Blair Cowan and Neil Clark, and drummer Signy Jakobsdottir. The performance will run the gamut from his masterful debut with the Commotions 'Rattlesnakes' right up to last year's acclaimed *On Pain* touching on all points in between.

Cole says: "After many wonderful years in Gothic Islington I'm thrilled to finally bring my music to brutalist EC2. The concert hall's acoustics should be perfect for our sound."

Last summer **Lloyd Cole** released *On Pain*, his twelfth album as a solo artist. He has released 17 studio albums including three with The Commotions [*Rattlesnakes* (84), *Easy Pieces* ('85), *Mainstream* ('87)] twelve solo albums [*Lloyd Cole* ('90), *Don't Get Weird On Me Babe* ('91), *Bad Vibes* ('93), *Love Story* (95), *Plastic Wood* ('01), *Music In A Foreign Language* ('03), 'Anti Depressant' ('06), *Broken Record* ('10), *Standards* ('13), *1D* ('15), *Guesswork* ('19), *On Pain* ('23)], one with The Negatives [*The Negatives* (2000)] and one with Hans Joachim Roedelius [*Selected Studies Vol. 1* ('13)].
