Haley Fohr of Circuit des Yeux: Salomé Wednesday 16 May 2018 / Cinema 1 / 20:00 Tickets £15 plus booking fee

American experimental musician **Circuit des Yeux**, otherwise known as Haley Fohr, will be joined by her band to perform a new soundtrack to the silent movie *Salomé* as part of the Barbican's contemporary music programme. This cine-concert takes place in Barbican's Cinema 1, where Fohr will be joined by Andrew Scott Young on bass, Whitney Johnson on viola, and Tyler Damon on percussion for a meeting of sound and vision, leaning on extended vocal technique and beat frequencies to reanimate the world of the scandalous 1923 film.

Salomé is a film adaptation of Oscar Wilde's play of the same name, and a retelling of the story of King Herod's stepdaughter. Conceived, produced, and starring Russian actress Alla Nazimova, the film was a resounding flop on release, shunned by the major studios for its salacious story and rumours of its star's debauched parties. In the years since, its combination of Art Nouveau, modernism and the glamour of Hollywood's Golden Age have led to its growing recognition as an exotic gem and a cornerstone of camp.

Begun as a solo project in 2007, Circuit des Yeux combines fingerpicked guitar, avantgarde electronics, minimalism and song with Haley Fohr's haunting voice.

Thomas Bartlett + Nico Muhly *Peter Pears: Balinese Ceremonial Music* Friday 8 June 2018 / LSO St Luke's / 20:00 Tickets £25 – 30 plus booking fee

The live iteration of a highly anticipated collaboration between **Thomas Bartlett**, also known as Doveman, and contemporary classical composer **Nico Muhly** features as part of the Barbican's contemporary music programme in 2018. Bartlett and Muhly will perform their forthcoming record *Peter Pears: Balinese Ceremonial Music* (Nonesuch Records, Spring 2018) in its entirety at LSO St Luke's on Friday 8 July.

Ten years in the making, this recording was born from a love of Colin McPhee's (1900-1964) transcriptions of Balinese ceremonial music for two pianos. The dual pianos translate the complicated overlapping patterns of gamelan music into a stylised, Western approximation. McPhee lived, in 1940, with the composer Benjamin Britten, his partner Peter Pears, W.H. Auden and other artists.

McPhee and Britten recorded the suite in 1941, and while the recording's audio quality is dated, it is evocative and points towards the music Britten wrote before his death in 1976. Bartlett and Muhly decided to write a set of nine songs loosely based on the textures and interlocking rhythms from McPhee's transcriptions, as well as the various resonant sounds from Balinese music, but consolidated into their own stylised processes.

The project is named after Peter Pears, who, in addition to being Britten's partner, was an observer and collaborator not just of Britten, but of a larger community of musicians, writers, and thinkers.

Both artists are making a return to the Barbican music programme; Nico Muhly's

numerous previous appearances include his curation of Barbican's marathon weekend in 2013, whilst Thomas Bartlett appeared as a member of The Gloaming in 2015 and with Anohni in 2008.

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Michael 'Mikey J' Asante: Outliers Saturday 30 June 2018 / Barbican Hall / 19:30 Tickets £17.50 – 25 plus booking fee

Michael 'Mikey J' Asante, co-founder of award-winning hip-hop dance company **Boy Blue**, musician, DJ and producer, brings a dynamic combination of music, dance and video to the Barbican this summer in the form of **Outliers**. This new work is part of the Barbican's 2018 season, <u>The Art of Change</u>, which explores how artists respond to, reflect and can potentially effect change in the social and political landscape.

On stage Mikey will take the helm on electronics, accompanied by an ensemble of musicians and a number of special guest performers, all assembled to bring his compositions to life. *Outliers* will feature contributions from his long-time collaborator and fellow Boy Blue founder, choreographer **Kenrick 'H2O' Sandy** MBE.

In his own words Mikey states that "an outlier is inadvertently standing up for something they want to challenge and changing the way people see something from that point on". He admits that his way of thinking has changed a great deal over the last ten years, in part as a result of getting older but also in response to a shift in social and public consciousness that has inspired a number of movements and debates currently questioning issues such as race, class, gender and equality. Mikey adds that "this concert for me is a step to add to the canon of Hip Hop culture."

As Mikey reflects on his recent achievements – invitations to Buckingham Palace and Number 10 Downing Street, five star reviews and an Olivier Award nomination – he thinks back to his younger self, who never considered the thought of success, and only ever focused on creating what was true to himself. *Outliers* challenges this thinking and its blind spot to opportunities.

Mikey's extensive music credits also include projects with Kano, George The Poet, Raleigh Ritchie and Estelle. As part of Boy Blue he collaborated with Danny Boyle and Underworld to create compositions for part of the London 2012 Olympic Games Opening Ceremony.

As Barbican Artistic Associates, this year Boy Blue also present **A Night With Boy Blue** (1-2 June), and reprise the Olivier-nominated **Blak Whyte Gray** (12-15 Sept) in the Barbican Theatre. Alongside **Barbican Young Poets**, Mikey and dancers from Boy Blue appear in **A Change Is Gonna Come** (25 & 26 May, The Pit). *Blak Whyte Gray* and *A Change Is Gonna Come* also form part of the Barbican's 2018 season <u>The Art of Change</u>.

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monumental: Godspeed You! Black Emperor & The Holy Body Tattoo Friday 13 & Saturday 14 July 2018 / Barbican Hall / 19:30 Tickets £20 – 30 plus booking fee

Two Canadian creative powerhouses, **Godspeed! You Black Emperor** and **The Holy Body Tattoo**, bring their collaborative music and dance performance, *monumental* to London for the first time, following performances around the world – including 2016's Edinburgh International Festival. Presented in two performances on 13 and 14 July 2018, this work marries the apocalyptic post-rock soundscapes of Godspeed! with the similarly impassioned and ferocious stylings of contemporary dance company, The Holy Body Tattoo.

In *monumental* Godspeed!'s eight members play from the shadows of the stage, surrounding nine dancers atop plinths. As the crescendos of the band fill the space dancers embody movements of everyday life, but in an increasingly frenetic fashion. *monumental* explores themes of anxiety and urban culture, of human connection, the need for intimacy, and fragility, from within the context of modern day cities. A multimedia experience, *monumental* features lighting design by Marc Parent, video by director William Morrison and text from conceptual artist Jenny Holzer.
