Barbican Foyer Exhibition, 4–25 September Celebrating 125 Years of City of London School for Girls

Opened in 1894 and located in the heart of the Barbican since 1969, City of London School for Girls is an independent day school for 7 to 18-year olds, providing an outstanding education to able girls from all backgrounds, cultures and faiths.

Marking its 125th anniversary, this exhibition explores the history of the school through photographs, artefacts and memories of former pupils. Step back in time as you learn about key moments in the life of this unique school, from its evacuation to Yorkshire during World War II, to the pupils' first cross-channel relay swim from France to Dover.

Barbican Music Library: 11 July-30 September Geoff Dunbar - Art into Animation


The multi-award-winning animation work of **Geoff Dunbar**, whose films include 'Rupert Bear and the Frog Song' for Sir Paul McCartney and the BBC's 'The World of Peter Rabbit and Friends', will be exhibited at Barbican Music Library over the Summer.

Dunbar, who collaborated with Sir Paul on the 'Frog Chorus' and 'Daumier's Law', based on the work of the French caricaturist and painter, Honoré Daumier, has won several major awards, including two BAFTAs, a Palme d'Or, and a Golden Bear during a prolific career that spans over four decades.

Geoff Dunbar said:

"I am delighted to have been invited to exhibit a selection of artwork from my animated films at Barbican Music Library, and that the opportunity enables me to put most of it on public display for the first time.

As well as bringing back happy memories of watching the films, I hope that visitors will share my enthusiasm for viewing art from the so-called 'golden age' of British animation, before CGI wizardry and digital manipulation were introduced."







'Geoff Dunbar. Art into Animation' opens at the City of London Corporation's Barbican Music Library on 11 July and will showcase some of the hand-crafted and meticulously detailed drawings created for films by Geoff and his team of animators.
