Acclaimed composer **Max Richter** returns to the Barbican Hall for two special orchestral performances on 1 and 2 October 2022. Alongside **12 Ensemble**, Richter presents six ambient works in both performances, three of which – <u>Exiles</u>, <u>Opus 2020</u>, and <u>Testament</u> – will be UK live premieres.

In this new project, Richter uses the orchestra, rather than electronic instruments, as a medium for exploring ambient music, and has curated a selection of his pieces that provide a context for reflection and feelings. *Ambient Orchestra* is concerned with the intersection between music and its listeners' individual experiences, and the way that musical performance can become conversational.

One of the UK's leading chamber orchestras, 12 Ensemble previously collaborated with Richter in 2018 for the Barbican's <u>Sounds and Visions</u> weekend. 12 Ensemble's expanded configuration for these performances will feature strings, wind, brass, percussion, harp and piano, with soprano Grace Davidson.
