After an unforgettable sold-out performance in 2021, **Charles Lloyd**, the iconic American saxophonist, flautist, and early global-music pioneer, is set to return to the Barbican with his new trio with pianist **Gerald Clayton** and guitarist **Marvin Sewell**.

With a career spanning over 60 years, Charles Lloyd has captivated audiences worldwide with his entrancing performances and has travelled widely in his own fertile imagination to cultures way outside his jazz origins. Cemented as one of the greats of our time, he has worked with jazz, blues,
