Get ready to witness a tour de force of talent and comedy as Olivier Award nominee and What's On Stage Award winner **Nigel Lindsay** (*Victoria / Shrek The Musical*) and What's On Stage Award winner **Hammed Animashaun** (*A Midsummer Night's Dream / Black Ops*) are set to take on the roles of the uproarious gangsters who sing in Cole Porter's classic musical comedy KISS ME, KATE for a strictly limited

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15-week season at the Barbican Theatre from 4 June.

They will join multi-award-winning actor **Adrian Dunbar**, making his musical theatre debut and Tony Award winner and Broadway Royalty **Stephanie J. Block**, making her West End debut alongside recently announced Olivier nominee **Charlie Stemp** (*Crazy For You, Mary Poppins*) and rising star **Georgina Onuorah** (*The Wizard of Oz, Oklahoma!*). Certain to steal the show in true criminal fashion, **Lindsay** and **Animashaun** will be bringing their razor-sharp wit to the Barbican stage, promising a performance that will leave audiences roaring with laughter and begging for more.

Nigel Lindsay said: "Kiss Me Kate is one of my favourite musicals. Bart Sher is a world class director and the cast he has assembled will rock the house. I am excited to be joining the team."

Hammed Animashaun said: "I'm very, very excited to be a part of this production and company! And I can't wait to get stuck in and brush up everyone's Shakespeare!"

Producer Howard Panter said: "I'm thrilled that Nigel Lindsay and Hammed Animashaun will be joining the cast of KISS ME, KATE. Nigel and Hammed are an absolute dream team. Their undeniable chemistry and comedic timing is sure to bring a fresh, hilarious energy to the roles of the gangsters. KISS ME, KATE is the perfect treat for London audiences – a show that promises an unforgettable theatrical experience for the whole family this summer".

One of the all-time classic musical comedy farces, **KISS ME**, **KATE** is making a long-awaited return to the London stage. From the producer of the smash hit musical *Anything Goes* and *A Strange Loop* (both staged at the Barbican), this majestic production of Cole Porter's musical masterpiece is set dazzle West End audiences once again this summer.

Directed by **Bartlett Sher** (*The King and I, South Pacific* and *To Kill A Mockingbird*), this all-star creative team have collectively won a remarkable 20 Tony awards between them. Joining the dynamic creative team is renowned choreographer **Anthony Van Laast**, accomplished costume designer **Catherine Zuber** and leading set designer **Michael Yeargan**. With music and lyrics by Cole Porter and the original book by Bella & Samuel Spewack, this new production, promises a symphony of wit, charm and musical brilliance. With a company of over 50, including a full-scale orchestra, and featuring Cole Porter classics such as 'Another Op'nin', Another Show', 'Brush Up Your Shakespeare', 'Tom, Dick or Harry' and 'It's Too Darn Hot' **KISS ME, KATE** is the perfect musical spectacle for 2024.

This musical farce which brilliantly showcases Cole Porter's razor-sharp wit, has won Best Musical at the Tony Awards. It's a sophisticated, ferociously funny, show within a show — which whisks you into a world of backstage chaos and romantic entanglements as a theatre company attempt to put on a production of Shakespeare's 'The Taming of the Shrew'. 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Nigel Lindsay

Nigel Lindsay has worked with many great names of contemporary theatre: playwrights Harold Pinter, Tom Stoppard, Martin McDonagh, Terry Johnson, Alan Ayckbourn and Patrick Marber and directors Sam Mendes, Michael Grandage, John Crowley, Josie Rourke, Rob Ashford and Max Stafford-Clark.

Nominated for Olivier, Irish Theatre, WhatsOnstage and Drama Desk awards, Nigel has appeared five times at the National Theatre; as Bolingbroke opposite David Tennant in Richard II at the RSC/Barbican; at the Donmar, Almeida, Royal Court, Old Vic, Young Vic and in Ireland at the Abbey Theatre. He created the title role of Shrek for Dreamworks' award-winning musical at Drury Lane, has played Nathan Detroit In two West End productions of Guys and Dolls and appeared on Broadway in the triple Tony award winning The Real Thing. Most recently, Nigel was Henry Lehman in the sold-out Lehman Trilogy at the Gillian Lynne Theatre and appeared in An Enemy of the People with Matt Smith at the Duke of York's.

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His numerous TV credits include Robert Peel in Victoria, Walshy in White Gold, The Capture, Safe, Magnum PI, The Salisbury Poisonings, Unforgotten, Innocent, Poirot and The Tunnel. In film, Nigel appeared in Woody Allen's Scoop, in Alan Partridge: Alpha Papa, and was nominated for a British Comedy Award for his performance as Barry in Four Lions.

Hammed Animashaun

Hammed is a British actor from Hackney, East London. He began his acting journey aged 11, when he joined Half Moon Young People's Theatre. His first professional role was in the Manchester Royal Exchange's MOGADISHU in 2012. Since then he has become one of the UK's most in-demand stage and screen comedy actors, and has performed at some of London's most prestigious theatres, including the National Theatre, the Young Vic, and the Royal Court.

Hammed can currently be seen in a leading role as *PCSO Kay* for BBC Studios' new comedy-thriller BLACK OPS in which he stars alongside the show's creators, Gbemisola Ikumelo and Akemnji Ndifornyen. The six-part series follows eager officers Dom (Ikumelo) and Kay as they become embroiled in a high-stakes undercover mission for which they are woefully unprepared. Some reviews of the show are below:

Hammed also stars as the Ogier *Loial* in the Amazon Prime Video series THE WHEEL OF TIME, based on the novels by Robert Jordan. This fantasy epic follows the magician *Moiraine* (Rosamund Pike) as she leads a ragtag group on a journey across continents, hoping that one of them will be the Dragon Reborn, prophesied to either save or destroy the world.

In 2019, Hammed appeared in Nicholas Hytner's reimagining of Shakespeare's classic A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM. Leading the cast alongside Gwendoline Christie, Oliver Chris, and David Moorst, it was Hammed's interpretation of *Bottom* which won him numerous accolades. These included an Ian Charleson Award (2021), a WhatsOnStage Award for Best Supporting Actor in a Play (2020), a Critics' Circle Award for Best Shakespearean Performance (2019), and a Clarence Derwent Award (2019).

Hammed continued his 2019 stage success in the National Theatre's production of 'MASTER HAROLD' ... AND THE BOYS. This semi-autobiographical piece written by Tony Award-winner Athol Fugard explores the nature of friendship, love, and hurt in the context of apartheid-era South Africa. Hammed danced the big-hearted tearoom employee *Willie* into the foreground, a role which contributed to his winning the Clarence Derwent Award.

Hammed's other notable TV credits include series regular *Johnny Jackson* in the BBC Three mockumentary PLS LIKE alongside Liam Williams, and an appearance in the memorable BLACK MIRROR episode USS CALLISTER. He has also starred in Comedy Central's GODS OF THE GAME, BBC's BREEDERS, and Channel 4's FURIOUS ANDREW and WIZARD SLEEVE.

Hammed's major film appearances include the 2018 comedy THE FESTIVAL. In it, he plays *Shane Stubbs*, best friend to lead *Nick* (Joe Thomas) who he tries to drag out of his post-break up blues with a three-day festival binge. Other film credits include the role of *Elliot* in the upcoming comedy-horror THE

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LONELIEST BOY IN THE WORLD, and *Durab* in the Sundance thriller SURGE, starring alongside Ben Wishaw. He has also appeared in Film4's HOW TO BUILD A GIRL and Dan Scully's THE ELLINGTON KID.

It was recently announced that Hammed has started an exciting six-month writing residency with the BBC's Creator in Residence programme. He will be creating new scripted work based on his own original ideas.

In the West End, productions have also included On Blueberry Hill, The National Theatre's A Taste of Honey starring Jodie Prenger, Peter Nichols' A Day in the Death of Joe Egg starring Toby Stephens, Claire Skinner and Patricia Hodge, Equus by Peter Shaffer, the hit comedy Education, Education, Education, the acclaimed award-winning play Admissions starring Alex Kingston, new British musical Tom Morris' The Grinning Man, Apologia starring Stockard Channing and Killer Joe starring Orlando Bloom.
