# **Seating Information for NOYO Concert**

Please read this information to help you select the best seat for you.

- If you have any access requirements we suggest signing up to the Barbican as an Access Member so you can ensure you are directed to the best seating available for your needs.
- Please contact our Box Office team if you have any questions.

#### **Bean Bag Area**

- Book a seat in this area if you would like to sit on a bean bag rather than in one of the seating rows.
- This is an un-allocated area on the day you will be able to pick your bean bag, unless you have booked a wheelchair transfer seat (labelled 'T' on the booking page).
- We cannot position a wheelchair in this area unfortunately.
- There are two wheelchair transfer seats in this area. You will need to transfer from your wheelchair and this will need to be put to one side.
- Please ensure that your companion can support you to transfer in and out of your wheelchair.

## **Wheelchair Spaces**

- Wheelchair spaces are available in Row F of the Stalls and Row A of the circle
- These are spaces that can be booked for wheelchair users.
- There will be a seat available next to you for your companion.
- Companion seats will always be allocated and free if you request this when logged into your Barbican online account as an Access Member.
- We do not have suitable seats here for you to transfer into, if you would like to transfer out of your wheelchair please book a Wheelchair Transfer Seat.

## Wheelchair transfer seats (labelled 'T' on the booking page)

- These are seats which you can transfer onto from your wheelchair.
- Seats S3 and 21 are if you wish to transfer onto a standard Stalls seat.
- There are also two wheelchair transfer bean bag seats.
- These seats are labelled 'T' on the booking page.
- Please ensure that your companion can support you to transfer in and out of your wheelchair.


## **Standing Area**

- This area is for audience members who may not be comfortable remaining seated during the performance.
- There are seats in place, but you are able to get up if you wish and remain standing without blocking sightlines.
- Standing seats are available to book in advance on Circle Row A (seats A13-24 and A59-70).

## **BSL Sightlines**

- The BSL Interpreter will be positioned on the right side of the stage.
- We would suggest sitting on the right side of the auditorium (lower numbered seats) in rows H, J and K.
